So much bioeconomy is contained within a tree

Wood is the most important resource of the bioeconomy, an economic model that relies on renewable resources instead of fossil fuels. In biorefineries such as domestic paper mills, wood is broken down into its components, and each element is recycled for further use. A variety of products are produced at the 23 domestic sites.

Sustainability plays a central role throughout the process - from wood selection to the utilization of renewable resources, as well as the recycling of byproducts and their return to the production cycle.
